1 Thessalonians 2:13-20 NKJV Dr. Joshua Beckley, Senior Pastor

### INTRODUCTION

William Arthur Ward, Flatter me, and I may not believe you. Criticize me, and I may not like you. Ignore me, and I may not forgive you. **Encourage me,** and I will not forget you.

A Compliment - great motivator, particularly when thought put into Why, When, and How.

Most of the time, a Compliment should be given in public.

- If not possible in public, then convey your praise through a personal note that person can share with their families.
- As with all rewards, praise should be given immediately to provide the greatest reinforcement.
- Best time? Whenever God prompts you do it.

#### **ENCOURAGEMENT!**

God would have us to be "encouragers."

- ⊕ Hebrews 10:24 NKJV "And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works..."
- ⊕ Hebrews 10:24 NLT "Let us think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works."
- 1 Thessalonians 2:13-20, Paul practiced the character trait of encouragement.

#### WHAT ENCOURAGEMENT IS:

Encouragement when it is complimentary	

- a) **Announces Affection** we also thank God without ceasing!
- b) **Acknowledges Accomplishments** because when you received the word of God you welcomed it — as it is in truth!

**Welcomed** - means more than just hearing the Word and appreciating it. It means they respected, reverenced, embraced, and inculcated it.

c) **Affirms Actions** - For you, — became imitators!
